Use a revision guide (Hodder Education) to support the creation of a cornell notes page for each chapter charting the key events, characters, themes and quotations</li> <li>Plotting Jane and Rochester's love story: Create a visual timeline of their relationship throughout the novel with key quotations, events, settings and context</li> <li>Consider other 'loving' relationships in the novel – choose one to create a mindmap on</li> <li>Research the gothic genre. Where does Bronte draw on gothic elements in the novel? Create a mindmap of examples and their effect</li> <li>Re-read 'The Madwoman in the Attic' – consider how the relationship between Bertha Mason and Rochester is presented / how women are presented in literature more broadly</li> </ul>
